

However, for those expressing themselves more confidently in a different language, selective translation into English will be offered on a non-professional basis. For nearly all papers English abstracts have been circulated.

For each speaker a time slot of 40 minutes has been reserved, the first half of which should be used for presentation, the second half for discussion. Chairpersons keep time, stimulate discussion, and ensure that presentation does not eat too far into the discussion time.
